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PART I

A. COMBAT

1. GENERAL (1)

a. Location of Squadron; Serviceable Aircraft.

During the entire month of February the Squadron was based at San Jose, Mindoro, P.I.

On 1 February the Squadron had 14 serviceable A-20Ns and on 28 February there were 12 serviceable A-20Ns.

b. Combat Statistics.

25 missions for a total of 191 sorties were flown during the month of February. The average distance of the targets from base was 170.02 miles. A total of 644:50 combat hours were flown on these missions. 1,668 bombs, for a total of 98.54 tons were dropped on targets and a total of 166,550 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended in strafing. On one mission 14 M-10 (27 gal.) smoke tanks were emptied at the target.

2. DAILY MISSIONS (2) (3)

1 February - FPO 32-4-5 (4) The 8th Squadron was scheduled to furnish 6 A-20Ns for a search of the road network south of Manila and the road network north of Batangas Bay. A ground support target had been assigned, but was cancelled before the time of take-off. 3 planes were damaged in preparation for take-off and therefore did not participate in the mission. 1st Lt. Angiel led the remaining 3 planes, which thoroughly searched the two road-nets, but as no targets were sighted there was no expenditure of bombs or ammunition.

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2 February - FPO 33-A-6 (5) 6 A-20Ns were led by Major Greene on a ground support mission on this date. Radio contact was established with the ground stations which assigned a target near Mt. Corillo, west of Lake Taal. In addition the target was marked by smoke bombs from an L-5. The target was easily located and 24 single plane bombing and strafing passes were made over it. Direct hits were scored on a grass shack containing ammunition and on the 105 mm. gun position directly east of the shack. The entire area was thoroughly bombed and strafed. Slight, light, and inaccurate M/G fire was encountered. 60 X 100 lb. 4-5 second delay fuse para-demo bombs and 2 Napalm bombs were dropped. 10,800 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

FPO 33-A-9 (6) Captain Shook led 6 A-20Ns on a ground support mission against a target assigned by the ground station near the area. The target, a road network Northeast of Lake Taal, was searched and then 36 single plane passes were made along a road. All bombs dropped in the road area and the entire road was thoroughly strafed. 60 X 100 lb. 4-5 second delay fuse para demos and 4 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped. 11,400 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

4 February - FPO 35-A-5 (7) The 8th Squadron furnished 7 A-20Ns, led by Captain Dunkel, for a bombing and strafing attack on machine gun positions and troop concentrations south of Tagaytay Ridge. (This Ridge is on the Northwest edge of Lake Taal.) The target was assigned by the ground station and the assigned ridge was marked by smoke bombs from an L-5. 35 single plane passes were made and the area was well covered by bombing. The ground station ordered no strafing, but one plane had no radio contact and expended 440 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition into the target. 10 X 100 lb. 4-5 second delay fuse para demos and 74 X 100 lb. 8-15 second delay fuse demo bombs were dropped. Photos were taken.

5 February - FPO 36-A-20 (8) The 8th Squadron was called upon to furnish 7 A-20Ns to participate in a search for a Jap convoy reported in the Calamian Islands area. 7 planes thoroughly searched the Calamian Islands area and as far south as the northern part of Palawan, but made no sightings.

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6 February - PPO 37-A-2 (9) 10 A-20Hs of the 8th Squadron participated in a bombing and strafing attack on Fabrica A/D, Negros Island, led by Major Greene. The entire town area was thoroughly bombed and strafed. Direct hits were seen on the large drying shed at the lumber mill, on the power plant, on the lumber yard and on buildings in the labor quarters. Tracers were seen entering all of these targets. One previously unserviceable airplane was destroyed. 584 X 23 lb. instantaneous fuse para frag bombs and 20 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped. 13,680 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

7 February - PPO 38-A-8 (10) 10 A-20Hs of the 8th Squadron were scheduled to participate in an attack on enemy ground positions 4 miles west of Clark Field No. 6. Briefing was held at Lingayen. 9 planes, led by Major Greene, reached and attacked the target in 3 plane elements, each element making three passes. Napalm bombs and para demos covered the first two defensive positions thoroughly and direct hits were scored on entrenchments. Direct hits by Napalm bombs on the first ridge covered it with flames and started several grass fires. Intense, accurate M/G fire was encountered. One photographer was wounded in the head due to the M/G fire. One pilot could not completely retract the landing gear of his plane after leaving Lingayen, so he jettisoned his bombs in Manila bay and returned to base early. 32 X 250 lb. 4-5 second delay fuse para demo bombs and 18 X 100 lb. Napalm fire bombs were dropped on the target. 4 X 250 lb. para demos and 2 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were jettisoned. 4 X 250 lb. para demos were returned to base. 15,300 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

8 February - PPO 39-A-10 (11) 2 A-20Hs of the 8th Squadron, piloted by Major Greene and Captain Shook, participated in a 4 plane special mission against Corregidor Island. A sub-chaser was hit and was seen burning fiercely. Barges along the shore were thoroughly bombed and strafed. Photos were taken. 8 X 500 lb. demos and 4 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped and 3,600 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended by the 8th Squadron planes.

9 February - PPO 40-A-2 (12) The 8th Squadron was scheduled to furnish 10 A-20Hs for an attack on targets of opportunity on the southeast coast of Bataan, from Limay to Nagabataan Point. After 4

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planes had taken off, the field was closed due to the condition of the strip. Captain Shook led the first 4 planes which attacked the target in two plane elements. 4 single plane passes were made over Cabacben to try to locate a gun position reported to be there. Piles of boxes and other supplies at Limay were bombed and one direct hit was scored. Fire bombs were dropped on several large shacks at Likanin. The Cabacben area was thoroughly covered by bombing and strafing and was further searched for 35 minutes. One barge in a cove south of Real Point was sighted and destroyed by a direct bomb hit. Propaganda leaflets were dropped. Light M/g fire was encountered. The second flight, consisting of 6 planes, led by Lt. Col. Ellis, Group C. O., flying an 8th Squadron plane, reached and attacked the target in 3 plane elements. Each element made one bombing and strafing pass over the target area. Two bundles of propaganda leaflets were dropped. 36 X 250 lb. A-5 second delay fuse para demos and 20 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped on the target and 12,720 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. One plane jettisoned 4 X 250 lb. para demos over the water. Photos were taken.

10 February - FPO 41-A-6 (13) 1st Lt. Gosson led 10 A-20Hs in an attack on targets of opportunity on the southeast coast of Bataan Peninsula, from Limay to Nagbatalan Point. 10 planes reached and attacked the target area, making a single pass from south to north in 3 plane elements. The entire area was thoroughly covered. One very large fire was started in Lakanin, with flames rising to 200 feet and black oily smoke, giving the appearance of a fuel fire. Light M/g fire was encountered. 38 X 250 lb. A-5 second delay fuse para demos and 20 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped. 2 X 250 lb. para demos were salvaged. 7,920 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken. Propaganda leaflets were dropped.

11 February - FPO 42-A-2 (14) 1st Lt. Rogala led 9 A-20Hs in a minimum level bombing and strafing attack on the Mariveles area. 9 planes reached and attacked the target in 3 plane elements, making one bombing and strafing pass. Both Sisiman and Mariveles were well covered by the bombing and strafing. Slight, inaccurate M/g fire was encountered. Propaganda leaflets were dropped. 36 X 250 lb. A-5 second delay fuse para demos and 18 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped. 8,160 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

FPO 42-A-6 (15) The 8th Squadron furnished 10 A-20Hs for a second attack on the Mariveles area on this date. 10 planes, led by

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Lt. Col. Ellis, Group C. O., flying an 8th Squadron plane, reached and attacked the target. Propaganda leaflets were dropped. 37 X 250 lb. 4-5 second delay fuse para demo and 20 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped. 3 X 250 lb. para demos were returned to base because no target was sighted. 10,860 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

12 February - FPO 43-A-1 (16) The 8th Squadron was scheduled to furnish 10 A-20s for an attack on the Cabcaban area. 10 planes, led by Lt. Col. Ellis, Group C. O., who flew an 8th Squadron A-20, took off from base and attacked the target in 3 plane elements. The entire coastal area was thoroughly strafed and bombs struck along the road in the Cabcaban area and in Lokania. Slight, light and accurate A/A fire was encountered. 2 planes were holed. Propaganda leaflets were dropped. One plane of the original 10 failed to return from the target and 2 planes were sent to look for it. These 2 planes landed safely at base 45 minutes after the first 7, after an unsuccessful search. A 90th Squadron sighting reported one 8th Squadron airplane was seen to crash in the water and burn 600 yards north of Limay village. No one was seen to get out. 36 X 500 lb. 8-15 second delay fuse demos and 18 X 250 lb. 8-15 second delay fuse demo bombs were dropped. 8,600 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

FPO 43-A-4 (17) 3 A-20s of the 8th squadron, piloted by Lt. Col. Ellis, Group C. O., Major Greene and Captain Shook, participated in a special mission against enemy concentrations in the Cabcaban area. 36 X 100 lb. Napalm bombs were dropped and 5,520 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended by the planes of the 8th Squadron.

13 February - (18) Major Greene, Ass't. Group Operations Officer, led 10 A-20s of the 8th squadron on a mission to provide smoke cover in the Bataan-Corregidor area. The area was circled for more than two hours, but no target was assigned. All smoke tanks were returned to base. This mission was scheduled per FPO 44-A-18.

FPO 44-A-17 (19) Two 8th Squadron A-20s, piloted by Major Fredericks of the 13th Squadron and Lt. Col. Howe, Group Deputy Commander, participated in a special mission on this date. Bombs were dropped through gun positions at the center of Caballo Island. The Cabcaban area, as well as Caballo Islands, was well strafed by all 3 planes which participated. Photos were taken. The 8th Squadron

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planes dropped 8 X 500 lb. 8-15 second delay and 4 X 250 lb. 4-5 second delay bombs. They also expended 3,600 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition in strafing.

14 February - FPO 45-A-8 (20) The 8th Squadron was called on to furnish 10 A-20s to provide smoke cover in the Corregidor area. 5 planes, led by captain Shook, took off at 0900/I. These planes contacted the ground station, which assigned 3 of them to lay a smoke screen. This was done, with the screen extending east approximately 3,000 yards. The remaining 2 planes circled the area until 1215/I, but no target was assigned and they returned to base without making an attack or laying smoke. 5 planes, led by 1st Lt. Gosson, took off at 1130/I. The ground station was contacted and they were assigned to lay a smoke screen east down the center of the channel between Corregidor and Bataan. The planes laid their smoke screen from the requested starting point east for a distance of 5,000 to 6,000 yards. The screen was a thick blanket approximately 400 yards wide and remained on deck. 14 X 27 gal. M-10 airplane smoke tanks were emptied over the target. The smoke from two tanks leaked out on the return, and one of the tanks was salvaged. 4 tanks were returned to base. No bombs or ammunition were expended. Photos were taken.

FPO 45-A-13 (21) Two 8th Squadron A-20s, piloted by Lt. Col. Howe, Group Deputy commander, and 2nd Lt. Bais, participated in a special mission against Caballo Island. All bombs were dropped on the target and the target area was thoroughly strafed. Photos were taken. The 8th Squadron planes dropped 12 X 500 lb. 8-15 second delay fuse bombs and expended 2,880 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition.

15 February - FPO 46-A-1 (22) 12 A-20s were scheduled to provide smoke cover in the Bataan-Corregidor area. 10 planes from the 8th Squadron and 2 furnished by the 13th were led to the area by Major Greene, Ass't. Group Operations Officer. Contact was made with the ground station which gave orders to orbit until called. At 1035/I the ground station instructed them to return to base, as there was no target.

16 February - FPO 47-A-5 (23) Captain Shook led 10 A-20s, carrying both smoke tanks and bombs to the Corregidor area to be assigned a target. The ground station was contacted, which assigned Caballo Island as a bombing and strafing target. The planes made three passes in 3 plane elements, from north to south. 55% of the

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bombs dropped in the assigned area. The target was thoroughly strafed. On return a practice smoke screen was laid by 9 planes 15 miles off shore west of Mindoro. Due to complete failure of electrical system, one plane returned to base with all bombs, smoke and ammunition. 36 X 250 lb. 4-5 second delay fused para dems were dropped. 13,440 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended. 4 X 250 lb. para dems were returned to base. On return, 18 X 27 gal. M-10 smoke tanks were emptied.

FPO 47-A-3 (24) Lt. Col. Howe, Group Deputy Commander, flew an 8th Squadron plane on a special strike mission on this date. This plane dropped 4 X 250 lb. para dems, 2 X 250 lb. dems, and expended 1,440 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition on targets on Corregidor and Caballo Islands.

20 February - FPO 51-A-2 (25) Captain Shook led 12 A-20Ns of the 8th Squadron in a low level bombing and strafing attack against Puerto Princesa. The planes attacked in two plane elements, with each element bombing and strafing its specific target. Bombing was assessed as excellent, with direct bomb hits observed on every building but one, which had near misses. One very large black smoke fire, believed to be fuel stores, was started 400 to 500 feet southeast of the base of the jetty. Strafing was thorough, but limited only to the assigned buildings. Photos were taken. All planes returned safely. 8 P-47s provided fighter cover. Propaganda leaflets were dropped. 118 X 100 lb. para dem 4-5 second delay fuse bombs were dropped and 6,990 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended by the 12 A-20Ns of the 8th Squadron.

25 February - FPO 56-A-8 (26) Captain Shook led 12 A-20Ns of the 8th Squadron on a shipping sweep of the east and north coasts of Luzon and in a low level bombing and strafing attack on the Aparri town area. No serviceable boats other than native craft were sighted on the shipping sweep. The planes attacked the secondary target in Aparri. All bombs struck in the assigned area, destroying at least 3 buildings. Smoke and dust obscured results for the most part. Photos were taken. 47 X 250 lb. 4-5 second delay fuse dems were dropped and 9,610 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended by the planes of the 8th Squadron. The plane flown by Lt. Col. Ellis dropped 4 X 250 lb. para dems and expended 800 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition.

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26 February - PFO 57-A-3 (27) 9 A-20Ms, led by 1st Lt. Gosson, accompanied by Lt. Col. Ellis, Group C. O., participated in a low level bombing and strafing attack on Puerto Princesa on this date. No attack was made on the first pass, due to P-38s strafing in a head on pass toward the A-20s. Each element then made two bombing and strafing runs. All bombs hit in the target area, which was a 4,000 yard long strip between the runways. Results were unobserved due to smoke and dust. Photos were taken. 87 X 100 lb. para demos and 16 X 250 lb. demos were dropped and 10,300 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended by the nine 8th Squadron planes.

27 February - PFO 58-A-2 (28) 1st Lt. Angiel led 12 A-20Ms in an attack on stores and a personnel area along a road north of Puerto Princesa. One pass was made over the target in 3 plane elements from north to south. The entire target area was thoroughly bombed and strafed from a point 5,000 yards north of the strip to a point 1,000 yards north of the strip. Slight, light, accurate to inaccurate A/A fire was received. One plane was holed. Photos were taken. 113 X 100 lb. para demos and 24 X 250 lb. demos were dropped and 9,050 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition were expended by the 12 planes of the 8th Squadron.

a. Training, Courier and Local Flights. (29)

2 February - Captain Weigel made an administrative flight to Samar and returned.

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14 February - 2nd Lt. Appler flew a courier mission to Leyte and returned the same day.

16 February - F/O Shrum flew a courier mission to Leyte and back on this date.

17 February - 2 A-20Bs, piloted by Major Greene, Group Operations Officer, and Captain Campbell, flew local test flights for the purpose of testing Torpex bombs. On this flight the plane flown by Major Greene was seen to explode and crash.

23 February - Captain Dunkel flew a courier mission to Leyte and returned the same day.

25 February - Group "Fat cat" was flown to Leyte for baggage by 1st Lt. Krogh and 2nd Lt. Gands. They returned on the same day.

b. General - Intelligence and Operational Instructions. (30)

During the month of February, pilot meetings were held each evening. All strike missions were thoroughly discussed and the pilots were briefed on all bombing restrictions, flight regulations and escape routes. Other problems pertaining to Intelligence-Operations were taken up at this time.

On 2 February a lecture was given by a representative of MIG-Y section, at the Group war room, on escape and evading of capture by the enemy on Formosa and China, which was attended by 8th Squadron pilots and gunners.

At a meeting of all pilots and gunners on 21 February, 1st Lt. Leonard Grovlin, of Photo Intelligence, V Bomber Command, spoke on "Identification of Enemy Warships and Merchant Vessels".

The latest news and situation reports on all theaters were given daily by the Intelligence Officer or Assistant Intelligence Officer.

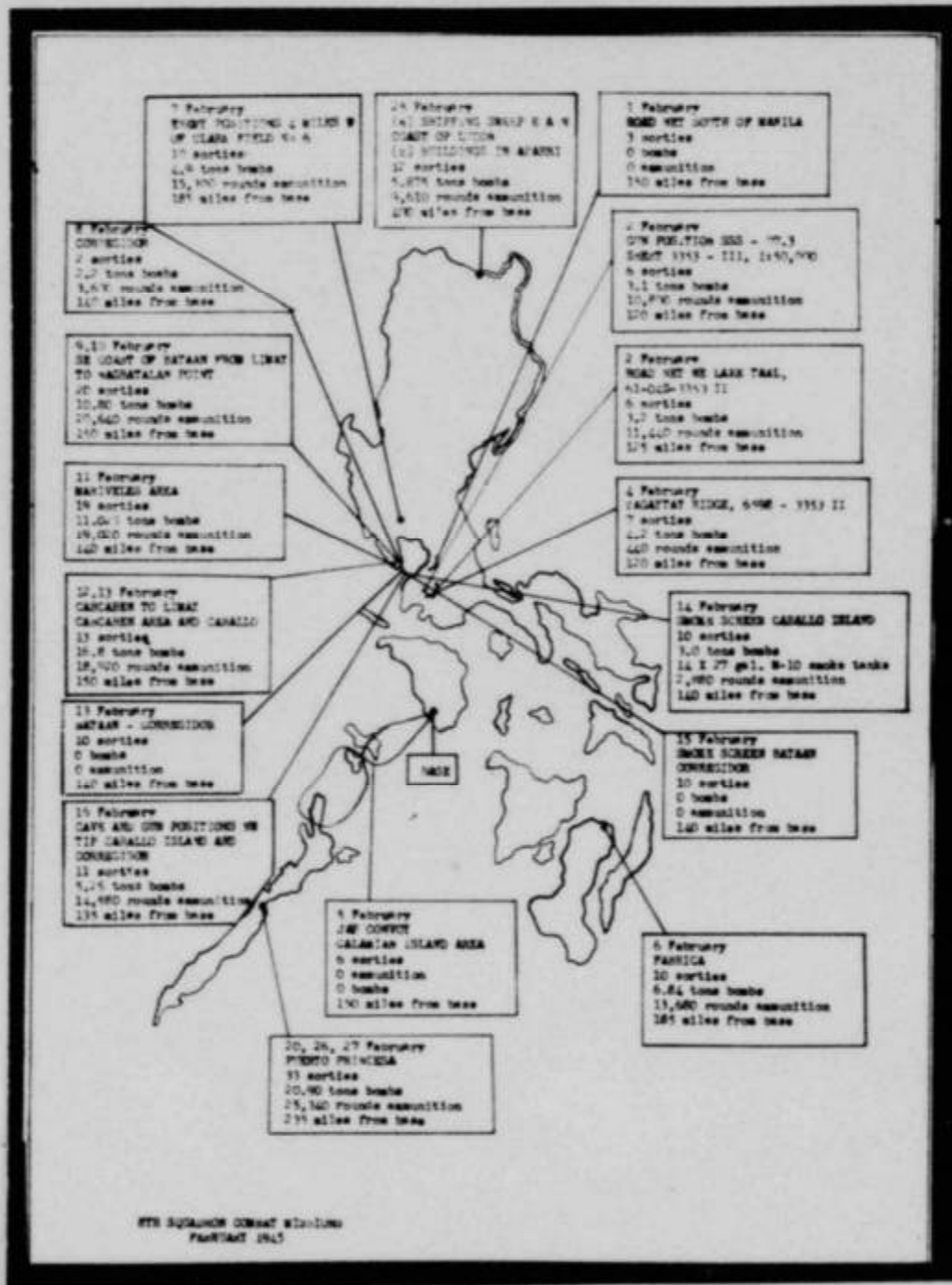

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ADMINISTRATIVE

1. General:

The 8th Bombardment Squadron was stationed at San Jose, Mindoro, Philippine Islands throughout the entire month. Major George T. O'Keefe was in command until February 17th when he was appointed 3rd Bombardment Group Operations Officer. Captain Abraham C. Shock then assumed command of the squadron (1).

On February 1st, the strength of the squadron was 45 officers and 113 enlisted men. 33 officers and 65 enlisted men were members of combat crews. It decreased to 41 officers and 237 enlisted men on February 28th. 29 officers and 40 enlisted men were flying personnel. (2)

Technical Sergeant Bridges, Staff Sergeants Giroux, Heath, Ward, Langston and White, and Sergeant McKay returned to the United States under the plan for rotation of overseas personnel. They had spent 35 months in the Southwest Pacific theater of operations. (3) Master Sergeant Huskko, Technical Sergeant Flynn, Staff Sergeants Nines and Sierwerts, and Sergeant Cinnwald, airplane crew chiefs also returned to the States. (4) Combat personnel who were sent back to the United States for rest and rehabilitation were: Captain Inskel (5), Shultz and Neigel, 1st Lieutenants McFadden (6) and Higgins (7), and Staff Sergeants Brewer, Burniston (8), and McHoney (9).

Technical Sergeant Voldis and Staff Sergeant Axtell went to the United States for a 30 day period of leave duty.

1st Lieutenant Wenzler was transferred to 3rd Bombardment Group Headquarters (10). Sergeant Brennan and Corporal Long were sent to the 300th Bombardment Group. (11) Sergeant Reid, Corporal Evans, and Private Shippee were transferred as hospital patients.

2nd Lieutenant Meyer (12), Master Sergeants Krause, Hipner and Reynolds, Technical Sergeants Burke, Crowell, Fehner, Ferguson and Weston, Staff Sergeants Buss, Duggan, Jeffries and O'Dell, Sergeants Mahoney, Nixon, and Potter, Private First Class Knoss and Private Scott were the non-combat personnel assigned (13). Captain McAden, pilot (14), 1st Lieutenant Jenks, Bombardier (14) and Corporal Renolds (15) were the combat personnel assigned to the squadron.

The following combat personnel spent leaves and furloughs at Seiner, Australia: 2nd Lieutenant Bronson and Mallon (16), Staff Sergeants Clark (12) Gurtner and Landis and Sergeants Sobrowski and Vellis (16).

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The organization suffered four severe casualties. Major Jones was killed while performing a bomb test, two days after he had transferred to Group Headquarters. He had joined the organization on May 20, 1943 as a 2nd Lieutenant. By outstanding service he had advanced in the course of 16 months to Commanding Officer of the squadron. His combat flying and administrative efficiency will always be remembered by those officers and enlisted men fortunate to have served with him (17). Sergeant Lane, aviator with 16 months overseas service was also killed on this occasion (18).

2nd Lieutenant Kelton (19), and Sergeant Thomas (20) pilot and gunner were killed in aerial combat near Ilesay Village, Philippines.

1st Lieutenants Byrd and Barnwell were promoted to Captain (21). 2nd Lieutenant Jenks became a First Lieutenant (21). Enlisted men promoted were Staff Sergeant Armstrong, Bell, Lee and Hood to Technical Sergeants, and Sergeant Rabe to Staff Sergeant (22).

Staff Sergeants DeCantillon and Briesbach were awarded the Air Medal (23). Staff Sergeants Congdon (24), Corbin (24), Mahoney (26), and Sims (27) received an Oak Leaf Cluster to the Air Medal.



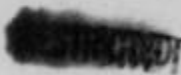
